RISK ASSESSMENT

This intervention is for those employees who need to understand the basic principles of risk assessment and those expected to contribute to the risk assessment process at all levels within the organisation.

Course content:

This Risk Assessment training intervention was created for those organisations which do not want an accredited course, but require their personnel to have a good understanding of the risk assessment process and be risk aware. Although not all employees in the organisation will be required to undertake risk assessments themselves, they may be requested to contribute to the process and will be expected to act always to protect their own health and safety and that of others.

- Legal requirements, The Health and Safety at Work Act 1974

Principles of risk assessment including:

- Hazards, risks and control measures.
- The hierarchy of control.
- The five steps to risk assessment.
- Risk assessment review and record keeping.

On completion of this course delegates will:

- Have the ability to contribute to both the maintenance of a safe work environment and to the process of formal risk assessment.

- Understanding the legal requirements for risk assessments.
